This is in reference to the controversy involving Dominion Power's efforts to build an ugly series of towers across the Rappahannock River versus laying electric cable on the seabed.

I spend winters on Pensacola Beach, Fla. There are two bodies of water to cross from Pensacola to this barrier island. One, a three-mile bridge to Gulf Breeze crossing Pensacola Bay, and the second, a one-mile bridge from Gulf Breeze to Pensacola Beach crossing the Intercoastal waterway.
